STACK V. CITY OF LEMOORE (2023) 91 Cal.App.5th 102, 308 Cal.Rptr.3d 45 (5th App. Dist.)

- Experienced jogger trips over a 1 ³/₄ inch offset that he regularly jogs over. Offset adjacent to a second offset.
- Upholding trial verdict, case rejects application of *Huckey v. Temecula* (4th App. Dist.).
- Now, any offset greater than one inch unlikely to be trivial

STACK V. CITY OF LEMOORE (2023) 91 Cal.App.5th 102, 308 Cal.Rptr.3d 45 (5th App. Dist.)

- Holistic/multi-factor test is not much different than *Fielder*, *Stathoulis*, and *Huckey*.
- Plaintiff's familiarity with the site is not a factor for DCPP. Although distraction may be a factor.
- Expert opinion cannot support DCPP as this is a factual question and an expert opinion cannot support the ultimate legal conclusion.

NUNEZ V. CITY OF REDONDO BEACH (2022) 81 Cal.App.5th 749, 297 Cal.Rptr.3d 461 (2ND App. Dist.)

- Sidewalk policy does not establish legal standard for a dangerous condition.
- Endorses Huckey standard focusing court on totality of circumstances.
- A "City does not have a duty to protect pedestrians from every sidewalk defect...only those that create a substantial risk of injury...."

HERNANDEZ V. CITY OF STOCKTON (2023) 90 Cal.App.5th 1222, 307 Cal.Rptr.3d 813 (3rd App. Dist.)

- Claim and Complaint both allege an uneven sidewalk.
- At deposition, Plaintiff explains he fell into an empty tree well.
- Appellate court upheld MSJ because his testimony does not "fairly reflect" the Claim.

MARTINEZ V. CITY OF BEVERLY HILLS (2021) 71 Cal.App.5th 508, 286 Cal.Rptr.3d 462

- Constructive notice differs whether offset is in a sidewalk or alley or street.
- May indicate Court's willingness to evaluate substantial risk of injury based on location of offset.

TANSAVATDI V. CITY OF RANCHO PV (2023) 14 Cal.5th 639, 527 P.3d 873, 307 Cal.RPtr.3d 346

- Complaint alleged (1) intersection constituted a DCPP and (2) City had not adequately warned of the DCPP not apparent to motorists.
- Appellate court agreed City established design immunity. So, City was not liable for creating a DCPP, but design immunity does not apply to claim of failure to warn about the DCPP.

TANSAVATDI V. CITY OF RANCHO PV (2023) 14 Cal.5th 639, 527 P.3d 873, 307 Cal.RPtr.3d 346

- To prevail on a failure to warn claim:
 - Must show public entity had notice that its design resulted in a DCPP.
 - Must show that the accident-causing condition was a concealed trap.
 - Absence of a warning was an independent, separate, concurring cause of the accident.

TANSAVATDI V. CITY OF RANCHO PV (2023) 14 Cal.5th 639, 527 P.3d 873, 307 Cal.RPtr.3d 346

- Public entity has a continuing duty to review plan in light of its actual operation.
- Design immunity recognizes that the design may be the best engineers can do under the circumstances but still leave foreseeable dangers that can and should be addressed through appropriate warnings.

CITY OF CHICO V. SUPER. CT. (2021) 68 CAL.APP.5TH 352, 283 CAL.RPTR.3D 432

- Immunity for injuries caused by natural condition of unimproved property (Gov't Code § 831.2)
- Immunity applies even if City engages in periodic pruning and improved pathways throughout property.

DANGEROUS CONDITION OF PUBLIC PROPERTY TAKEAWAYS

- Expect more cases about one-inch offsets
- Consider a Sidewalk Inspection and Repair policy
- Tansavatdi means more considerations at design and continuing duty to review. Also means more warning signs.
